APPLICATION NARRATIVE:

Each section of the narrative should be clearly labeled as written below (such as Description of Applicant Agency) and in the order presented.

- a) Description of Applicant Agency (500 word limit): Provide a narrative description of the purpose and goals of the applicant agency, the agency's programs and services, geographic areas served, the number and type of people served, and organizational structure of the agency including the number and type of staff; programs, activities, or previous programmatic accomplishments; the agency's experience providing services; and effective use of existing community resources.
- b) **Description of Proposed Services**: Provide a descriptive summary of the proposed project(s)/activities. Be as specific and detailed as possible. (5000 word limit)
 - Describe your emerging or existing TICN and where you are developmentally in your work. Reference FACT's Framework for Building and Maintaining a Trauma-Informed Community Network (Attachment A) outlined in the RFA, where applicable. Include information about your backbone organization, your partners, and your key areas of focus and any other information that describes your TICN infrastructure.
 - 2. How will your TICN promote awareness of and responses to the research on ACEs, trauma and resiliency across the lifespan in your community?
 - 3. Describe how your TICN will work to change the community conditions that contribute to family violence across the lifespan in your geographic area.
 - 4. How will you measure your TICN's success? Please be specific, focusing on the short-term outcomes you cite in your logic model
 - Beyond funding, in what ways might FACT support or be a resource to your TICN?
- c) Need for Project: Describe the need for funding to support your TICN and the geographic area that will be impacted. What will your TICN accomplish with FACT funding that it might not otherwise be able to do? What work would be hindered if your TICN did not receive FACT funding? (500 word limit)
- d) **Description of Staff and Responsibilities**: Identify the staff responsible for service provision/project coordination included in the Logic Model (Attachment B) and Budget (Attachment C). Provide the positions, and qualifications of the staff, paid and/or volunteer included. Describe how staff will be recruited, if not already in place. Discuss the methods used to monitor staff performance. If the service is subcontracted, provide the name, qualifications and experience of proposed subcontractor. Describe any technical assistance and support that will be provided to volunteers, staff, and others and how success will be measured.
- e) **Logic Model**: Clearly define and discuss the inputs, objectives, activities and outcomes intended for the project and how they will be met. These must align with those included in the Logic Model form, Attachment B.
- f) **Evaluation**: Describe an evaluation plan to measure the degree of success in accomplishing project outcomes. The evaluation plan should include a mechanism for ongoing review, record keeping, data collection, and analysis of cost effectiveness.
