

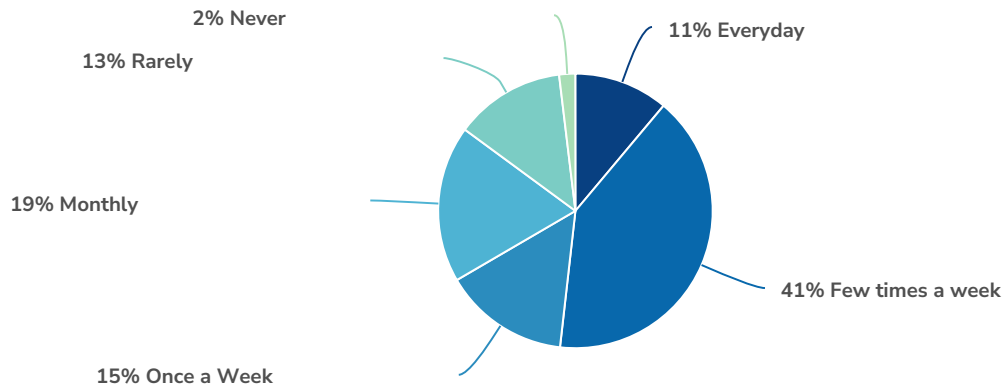

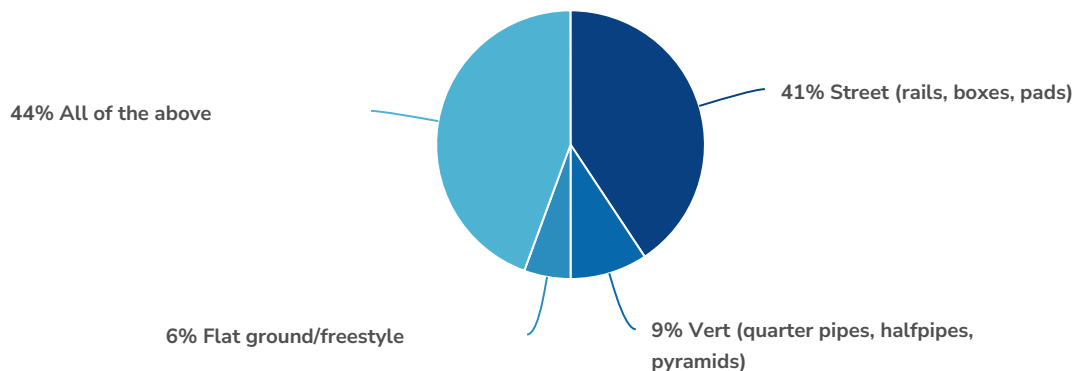

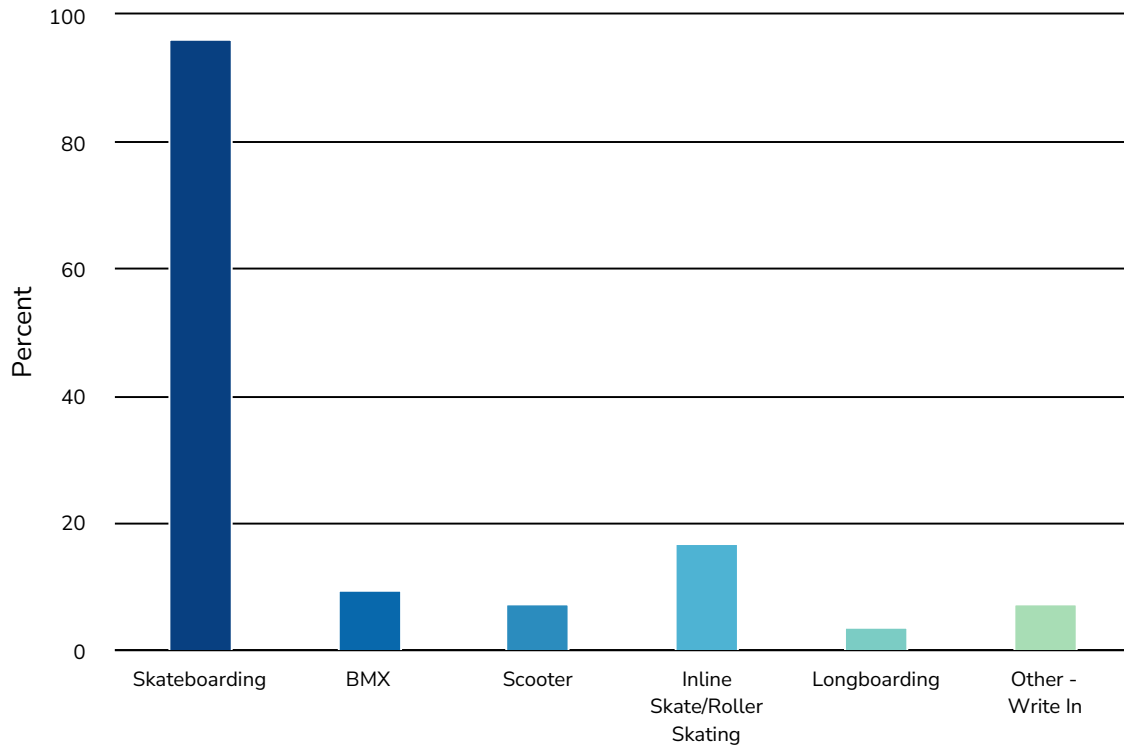
3. What style of skating do you prefer?

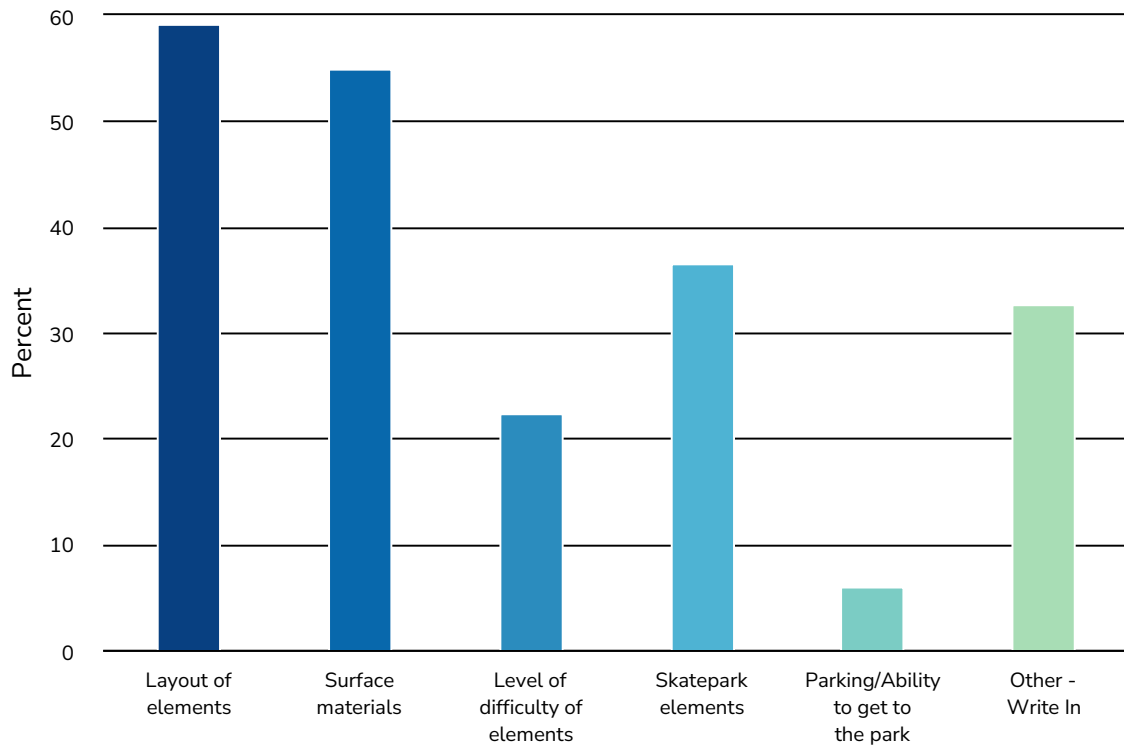

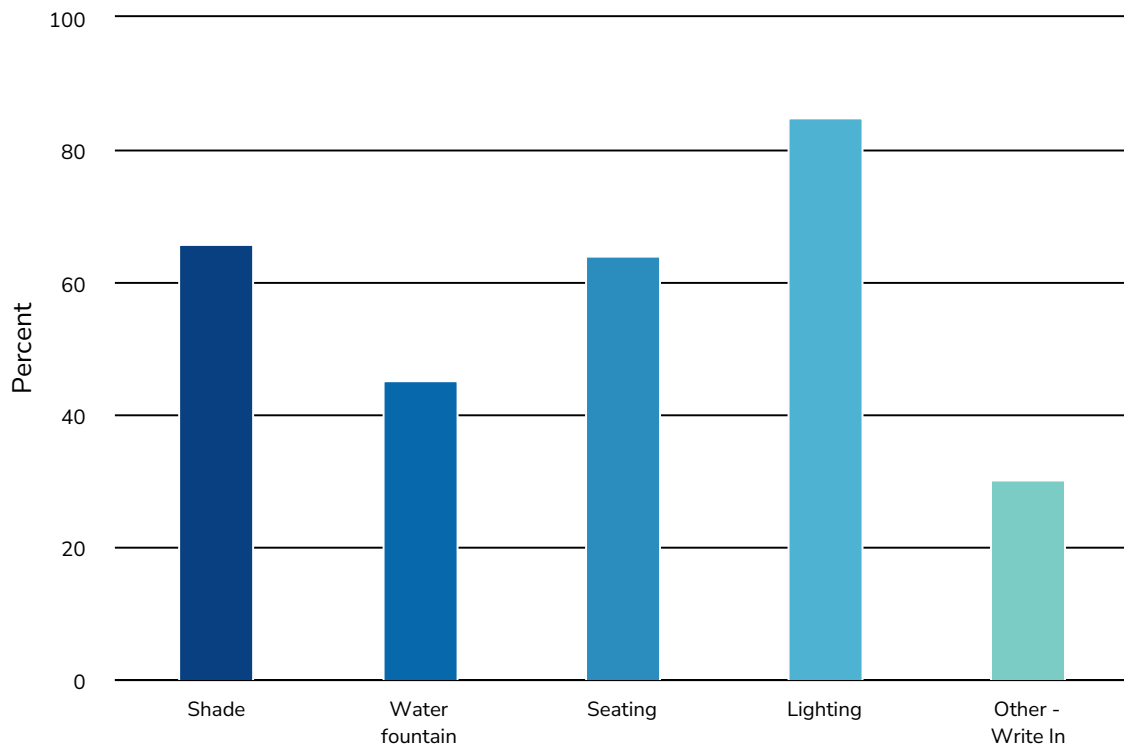

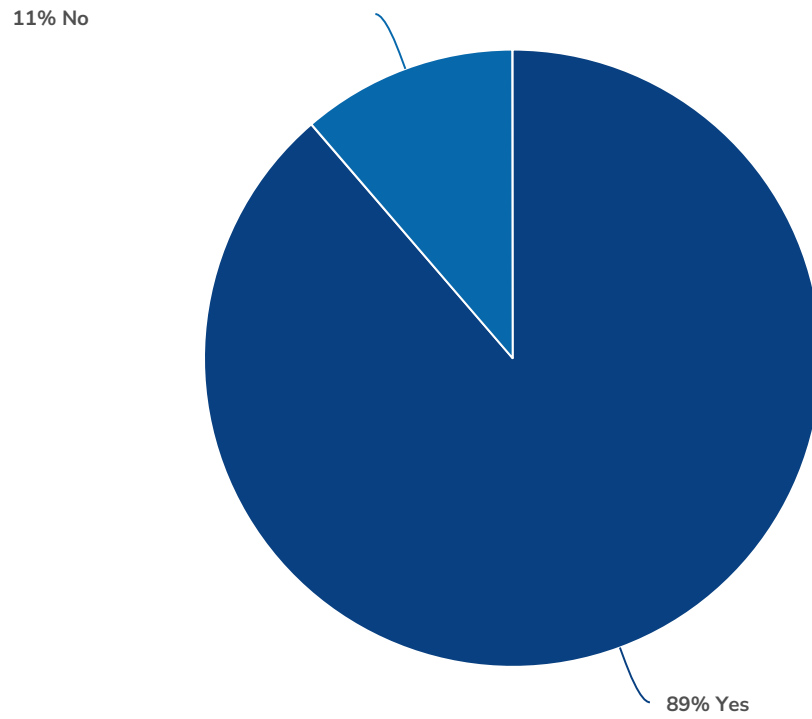

11. We're looking for your input on both short-term and long-term goals for the skatepark. For short-term goals, share your ideas below for quick improvements, like optimizing equipment for better flow or adding paint and signage. Your feedback will help us achieve this vision!

5 Add shade and spread the ramps and obstacles out more!

6 Shade and water would be the short term. Long term better flow, a variety of obstacles that are optimized for a variety of skill level. The addition of a concrete bowl and obstacles would be great.

7 Some short term improvements could be fixing the placement of the newer green rails (The kinked rail one runs into another rail to quickly after leaving it) and the location of ramptech launch ramp (it has no good runup). Possibly adding a smaller sized box/ledge off to side a quick addition. Long term I like to see more difficult street obstacles and as there are some holes in the ground and decay on the ramps

8 Park needs to be designed by someone who skates. The elements are too close together for actual use of them.

9 The two flat bars and ramp that were added to the park after the car accident are very dangerous. They're bolted to the ground and much to close to one another creating dangerous obstacles. Additional the new ramp that was included also functions as a skateboard box which is not able to be utilized to the fact it's bolted. Those need to be changed. As far as longterm goals, the park is simply too outdated to current skateboarding trends, which is understandable being this park was built 20 years ago and has received no material update. The park has lots of wasted space that need to be utilized, which a gut job and revamp of a concrete park would cure.

11 Either rearrange the flow of the skatepark for all users using the elements you already have or restart and rebuild a concrete part. With bowls, mini half and a better street coarse

12 Replacement of half pipe because of water damage.

13 Remove some elements to create space. Add lights so the park can be accessible later (especially in the winter when the sun sets at 5).

14 • Move equipment for better flow

15 Put high quality rails and ledges - fix these first. But a full renovation is needed.

16 Move around ramps. Remove the ones that can't be repaired to be usable.

- 17 From what I concluded the most effective immediate, albeit laborious method for a short term project is to reorganize the park with the existing elements to make better use of the real-estate of the park. I've surveyed the area and one of the biggest conflict the park is suffering from is a lack of natural flow and poor integration of elements of the park. From what I've put together the park would be reinvigorated with a renovation of moving things around in a more congruent fashion.
- 18 I think the skate park should be fully concrete with a bowl and Street course obstacles
- 19 Smoother floors/ cutting away tree and heavy bushes that surround the skate park. A more open fresh & cheerful look.
- 20 Fix the stuff that's messed up and plan for a new layout . That park needs a real renaissance
- 21 A sun shade over half the park like a triangle. Made of AG netting would allow shade to move through the park as the sun moved
- 22 Lights for skating at night has been discussed for years but never delivered. Flat bars were broken in a car accident and replaced with terrible quality rails that are insulting. Space is wasted with large corners of the park not in use.

- 24 Add colors!!
- 25 Bowls, but that isn't really a "quick" improvement.. Organized demos or events with pro-riders..maybe an Olympic team member, or a local skate-shop hosted team?.. Ty for asking for feedback!! Love that there is a parcel close enough to ride on weekends
- 26 -expand the park layout. Having a hard time why won't the walk path isn't being used as space for skate park -sidewalk for residents to walk around the skate park -safety for citizens on preventing cars getting into the park with the sharp turn at the intersection - some of the existing equipment can be used -would request on pavement to be updated
- 27 Better flow and shade !
- 28 Focus on small street features.(ledges, rails, curbs, parking barriers)
- 29 Quick improvements: cut the old launch ramp in half, which would be the perfect height for all skill-levels. Move the other (new, green) launch ramp to somewhere it can be used, like near the old one.
- 30 Definitely revamping the ramps. Adding lights and shade

32 Short term, make sure the cracks are properly filled and smoothed. Long term, keep some of the current elements if possible (consult long-time locals on what makes the park nostalgic), consider expanding toward the gas station a bit, create Olympic type street plaza, maybe even use Freedom Plaza as a model for some of the obstacles. Make it something where the obstacles aren't too big but well designed so that people at a pro level could hone their skills but that beginners don't feel intimidated. Hubba, stair set, rails, ledges, etc plus at least one unique obstacle.

33 Very features are too tall for novices. The flow is focused on big drops instead of long smaller verts that are easier for novice skaters. Powhatan is a great example of novice friendly layouts.

34 This park and the current layout is ok but too outdated to accommodate potentially future Olympic athletes or athletes in a higher caliber. A better, functional mini ramp. If concrete in the future, look at Rockville for Inspiration. Alexandria needs a concrete park with a bowl.

35 Have skate clinics for beginner skaters

36 Adding lights to the park so people can enjoy the park in the dark

38 removing some of the obstacles that just get in the way

39 If this park was well lit with the baseball field next door it would be great and used more by the locals as well as feel even safer for families. If the green flat rails could be replaced with the rails that used to be there as well that would be great! There are also a few patches/holes of concrete in the ground that can be considered dangerous for beginners that need to be filled .

40 Lighting would greatly improve the skatepark. Most folks with day jobs (parents of small kids included) tend to go to parks with light especially in the winter when it's dark early even if it may be a farther drive. I feel like the existing flow of the skatepark is good for the most part even though I am a bit bias since it's my local park. My only comment about the park would be to remove the three stair obstacle and replace it with a matching bank identical to the other side, as well as replacing the green rail with something more similar to the original rail that was in the park.

41 Please give this park a whole new upgrade. It's long overdue and the Alexandria scene could use an updated skatepark.

43 Please add lights. And more Street obstacles and more many pads/small ledges for beginner skaters. And please make the park bigger.

44 Lighting and longer hours would be an incredible improvement.

- 45 For short term goals you all should add add some new moveable skate obstacles that skatepark users can get creative with.
- 46 Replacing the rails that were originally there with metal taller ones
- 47 Short term provide some lighting immediately for evening skate sessions
- 48 Lighting is most important to me. When the car crash happened rails were replaced with "temporary" rails that are still there and are horrible quality so replace those with proper flat bars like there was before.
- 49 Make it hybrid concrete and wood. Add A mixture of boxes and manual pads. Better water fountain. Fix the half pipe
- 50 For the love of God, there's a company that's been building skate parks in nova that's been doing a horrible fucking job. Excuse my language, but their skate parks are falling apart within a year. Please do research on who you hire to build the skate park
- 51 remove fence, spread obstacles outwards to create more space inside. replace the set up of current rails situation
- 53 Optimizing flow is a great idea, I think some more open space with shade would be excellent as well
- 54 There should be street sections like stairs would be cool, a bowl would make it so much better you don't even know.the basic wood looks nice no pain necessary and if y'all add a bowl it should be a concrete color of course!
- 55 Short term goals: We had two of the best flat ground rails in Northern Virginia at the SHJ skatepark until a couple of years ago when the car burrowed through the park and took the rails with it. The good people at Ramptech provided the city with a couple of green rail substitutes, but they're not very well built. Especially for the skatepark environment where beginners would like to learn. It's only been a year or so since they've been installed and they already have deformations and signs of weathering. The legs extend too far out as well, making approaching the rail difficult. We need good bolted in flat ground rail substitutes for the rails we had pre-car accident of 2022. Please refer to the newly renovated Shaw Skatepark, or the old SHJ skatepark before the accident. Also, if we could include some lights that stay on after dark, I know the community/users of the park would be very pleased. I can't recount how many nights I've been at the skatepark with at least 10 other people enjoying a skate session that has to come to an end because the sun has set. Meanwhile the baseball park adjacent to the skatepark will have its lights beaming while not in use. For this reason, many prefer to go to Wakefield, Arlington, and even Shaw skatepark which have lights that stay on until 9.

The 3' ones that are there currently are a decent height, but if they could be 8' wide or resemble one you find on a Google image it'd be appreciated. The flat ground portion of the park in the back where no obstacles are is a staple to the park. It's great for beginners to learn new flat ground tricks, and it's great for people to warm up their legs. Please include the flat ground portion out of the way of obstacles to any renovations. A stair set that's 3-7 stairs high would be greatly appreciated as well. It could be a long 3 stair like Wakefield, or a normal 7 like Shaw. Any or all of these would be nice.

17	If we reach out of other foundations the stipulations are that the park will have to be constructed in concrete in its newer design before they will endorse it. They do incorporate park design surveyors that with work in congruency with city officials and reps to accommodate within the parameters of the existing park. I want to also take this time in making another suggestion of relocating the park to a better location. I've actually found a location that in relative proximity of the existing park. The area I'm suggesting is the deteriorated Ewald Park. The area already has infrastructure for restrooms facilities and meager parking. The deteriorated makeshift soccer field has been left moot and unused as the Brenman and Witter field began renovations. I'm unsure how the city feels about incorporating the basketball court into the real-estate as its barely used but would be optimal. The reason I suggested this area besides the aforementioned reasons are that the existing park has become and increasing safety hazard as cars keep hitting the park. Also because of the shade the area provides compared to the lack of at the existing park. Additionally the area falls within the provisions of being in a low-income area, a stipulation that contributing foundations mandate.

43	LIGHTS
44	If you renovate the park, please please please DO NOT PUT A LARGE SET OF STAIRS IN THE SKATEPARK. Almost anything that can be skated UP (like a ramp) can also be skated DOWN or OVER or ACROSS - they are multidirectional objects. Large stair sets are monodirectional objects, meaning they can only be skated in one direction (down). This then dictates the flow of every other multidirectional object around it, as other skaters now have to watch out for people jumping down the stairs. On top of that, unlike most skatepark obstacles, stairs can be found all over the place "in the wild" (outside of skateparks). Small sets of stairs (2-3) that can be skated up AND down can actually be lots of fun for people of all skill levels!

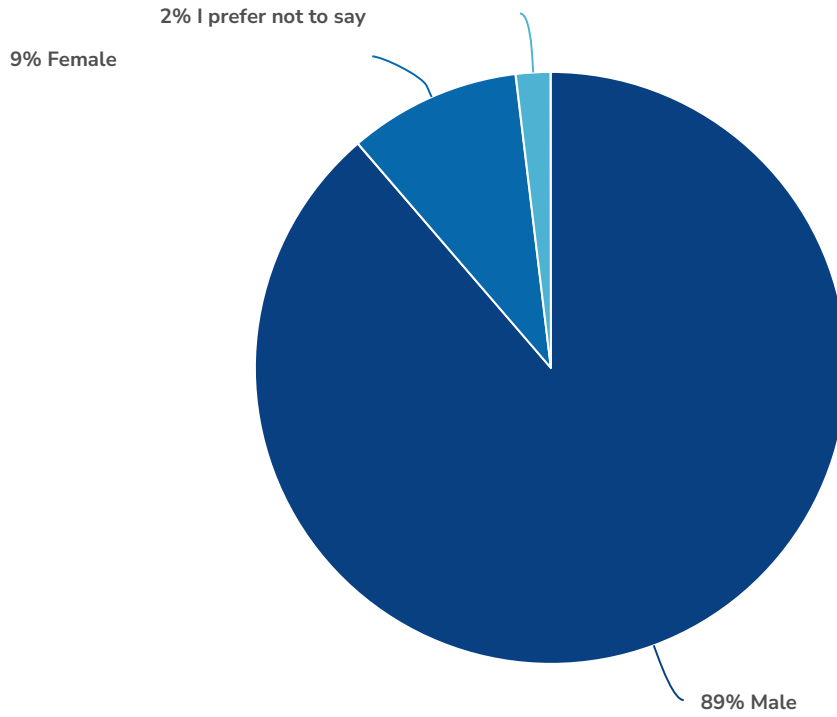

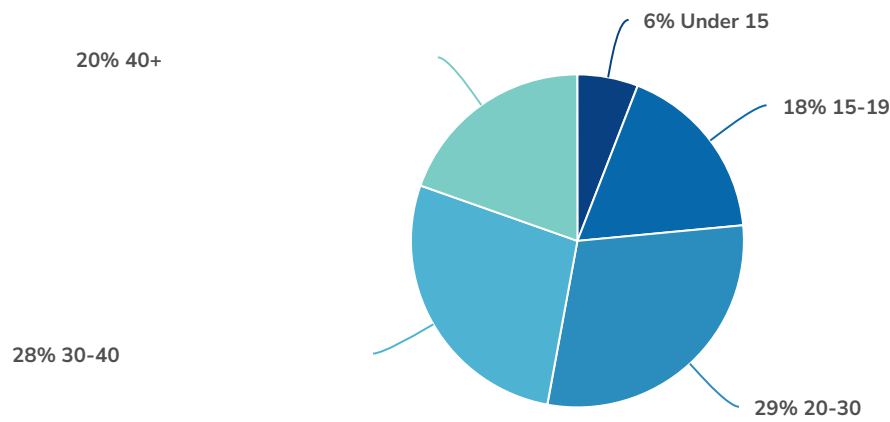
