Summary Minutes

1. Lebaron Reid, Chair, call the meeting to order

2. Items for Action

- a. January 2025 minutes were approved unanimously, with one abstention, with noted amendments.
- b. Robinson Terminal North (RTN) Subcommittee
 - i. Jan Abraham, subcommittee chair, provided an overview of the cover letter and the subcommittee's findings of the proposal as compared to the Waterfront Small Area Plan recommendations for the Robinson Terminal development site.

Summary Commission discussion:

Commission continued to stress the need to ensure safe navigation following the removal of the pier.

Commission continued to support the HOA/Management Company's maintenance of all land area and mitigate debris on the shoreline.

Commission continued to support, if possible, establish a temporary walkway along the shoreline during side development. In addition, Commissioners requested staff provide condition language requiring the developers to ensure a waterfront walkway and east side improvements be provided should the east side development be delayed or suspended.

Commission continued to have concerns with the amount of available parking, trash collection schedules and delivery for the proposed restaurants.

- ii. Catherine Miliaras, P&Z, informed the Commission the RTN DSUP will not be under consideration in potentially April or May. It was also conveyed that the removal of the pier was planned for the spring, and the demolition would also remove any damaged or loose piles.
- iii. The Commission decided to wait until March or April to finalize the recommendation if any additional changes were made by the applicant.

3. Items of Information:

- a. Waterfront Small Ara Plan Flood Mitigation
 - Matt Landes, DPI, informed the Commission City staff provided an update to City Council on January 28, 2025 and offered to ask any questions
 - a. Commission members asked what the BAR comments were on the proposed pumping facility. Mr. Landes stated a decision was not made that night and the BAR offered suggestions for the final design and placement. The BAR suggested a more modern approach and materials that are more historic in nature, were

more in favor with the Prince St. orientation, and were consistent with the Waterfront Commission and Park & Recreation Commission to design the smallest facility technically feasible.

 It was reported there were no substantial crime. It was conveyed that the pilot private parking enforcement had ended and that substantial tickets were issued.
